# Safety Prevention in Your Home

# Part I.

A friend from Round Table gave me a list of common hazards inside the home. There is no identification on the page regarding who composed the list, so I cannot give credit. However, I am going to share half the list with you this month and the other half next month because the ideas are worth using as a check-off list in your own home. See what you think.

- 1. Are strong banisters or railings placed along stairways?
- 2. Are stairs, halls and doorways free from clutter?
- 3. Do you keep your attic, basement, closets and garage cleared of old rags, papers and other combustible odds and ends?
- 4. Do you make it a rule never to use gasoline or other flammable liquids as cleaning agents in your home or garage?
- 5. Are towels, clothing, mops and brooms stored away from your space heaters, furnaces, and water heaters?
- 6. Are all gas-burning appliances properly vented, including space heaters, water heaters, and furnaces?
- 7. Are matches always lit before gas and pilot are turned on?
- 8. Are all matches kept in a closed metal container away from heat and flame and out of the reach of children?
- 9. Are safe ashtrays provided around

the house and never emptied into wastebaskets?

- 10. Are all adults aware of the dangers of smoking, especially in bed?
- 11. Are throw rugs eliminated or fastened down?
- 12. Are all electrical appliances in your home approved by Underwriters Laboratories, Inc. (UL)?

### Box Tops Masha Hemmerling


