The Placentia Round Table was founded in 1902. It is a member of Women's Club International and is in the city of Placentia, in Orange County, California. Placentia has a population of over 50,000 citizens. The club's focus is dedicated to raising money to support local and surrounding area schools, charities, our military, and citizens alike. Our membership is comprised of 116 women who live in and around Placentia, including the cities of Fullerton, Yorba Linda and Brea. The Placentia Round Table (PRT) strives to meet both the social and charitable giving aspects of membership, as well as maintenance of our beautiful clubhouse. We are one of the few remaining clubs who own and operate a physical clubhouse and grounds. We continue through social media, websites, and advertising to reach out to our community by offering our clubhouse for rent to prospective brides for weddings, mothers for baby showers and memorials for loved ones.

The most meeting throughout the year, the members were given a short presentation on a woman who changed history.

February: Lueila Thalmer who was President of PRT from 1925-1926 started our tradition of honoring our past presidents at our Feb. meeting.

March, Juliette Gordon Low, the founder of the Girl Scouts of America was discussed.

April, Gertrude Simmons Bonnin, Her Native American name was Zitkala-Sa (Red Bird) was the honoree. She was honored by a quarter in the American Women Series.

May: The designer of the Vietnam Memorial in Washington, D. C, Maya Ying Lin was introduced to the membership.

September: The We Do Declare Women's voices on independence was explained and the women who started this movement applauded for their efforts.

October, Ruth Bryan Owen Rohde who was the daughter of William Jennings Bryan and herself a political activist.

November: One of the more recognizable women, Elizabeth Cady Staton's work in abolitionist and suffragette movements were recognized.

Project Title: City of Placentia Historical Commission Hours 60 Donated 0 In Kind 0

The home of the founder of Placentia and one of the founding members of PRT is maintained by the Placentia Founders Society. It is used as a museum and community center for historic presentations and tours given to third grade students in our local school district. PRT maintains an annual membership of \$125.00 in this nonprofit.

Three members of PRT are on the board of this organization while 6 members serve as docents. During this past year, an inventory of the contents of the house was conducted with 2 members of PRT meeting weekly for several hours to help in this process.

Three members of PRT served on this commission. The main project this year was the planning for the centennial celebration which will take place throughout 2026. A book was written which will be sold to the public and one member of PRT was the co-author. The members presented information on the celebration at various venues throughout the year.
